

The Dispute Resolution Center of Yakima and Kittitas Counties is offering a Basic Mediation Training where trainees will receive 40 hours of instruction in the skills necessary to serve as a neutral third-party mediator, including hands-on experience in mediation and invaluable communication and listening tools that can help in every aspect of people's work and home lives.

The Granger Historical Society has raised over \$750,000 toward funding a new museum building for the community. We are working with 1973 Granger Graduate Jose Bazan, an architect, to finalize a design for the new museum. This museum will be located next to the existing museum/ library facility between Bailey and Sunnyside Avenues.

Many donations, both local and state, have already been pledged. We have raised nearly \$100,000 in local funding including several large donations of over \$20,000, and multiple small donations of \$50.00 and more. The state, through the assistance of Senator Honeyford, has contributed over \$650,000 to our project. But we are approximately \$50,000 short of our funding goal.

As a non-profit entity we will return a receipt for tax purposes with our EIN tax-exempt number. Just supply us the return address when donating.
